1. MINUTE OF PREVIOUS MEETING

2. REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS

FUND RAISING: LIZ

- An application for funding from SSE, pipe-line, will be submitted by 15th February
- Plans are underway for the Events Committee fundraiser, Strictly Come Dancing evening.
 A short-life sub- committee will be convened to organise this event.
- The 300 Club is ongoing.
- Contact was made with the PT Art at Milne's High regarding a joint venture and this received a very positive response.
 - The venture will include the design of a corporate logo to be used on stationery, posters etc.
- A strong application has enabled the application to Tsi Moray to progress to the next round. If successful, the money will be used to provide a stair lift.

HALL MANAGEMENT: ALAN

- The current balance is £17,861.63.
- The new bank account is operational.
- Enquiries have been made regarding two potential bookings, however, both parties
 would wish participants to bring their own bottles. This created a great deal of
 discussion but, ultimately, the decision was that, for reasons of insurance and risk
 assessment, no BYOB would be permitted.
- Mhairi Marwick has booked 4/5 sessions.
- An Ali Bain concert is booked for 7th September.
- Hall charges were confirmed as being the same as for the previous minute.
- There is a suggested application for bookings' form in the Moray Hall Federation Handbook. The current form will be compared with this and any necessary changes made.

PR: STEWART

- Two proposed structures for the Hall website were discussed.
- The corporate logo will be used on the site.

FUNDING: GORDON

- There has been a donation of £5000 from the Forsyth Foundation, Rothes.
- Gordon has spoken to John McKay, Miramichi, New Brunswick, Canada and is hopeful of funding from the group as musical events and the heritage work are within their criteria.
- For concerts etc. the Hall will be set up in a 4-8-4 arrangement allowing the use of two aisles. The balcony will hold 60, giving a total capacity of 350.

OPENING WEEKEND

THURSDAY: A preview event for sponsors and 300 Club members at which drinks and nibbles will be served, will take place between 7.00 and 8.30pm. Brodie's film will be shown.

FRIDAY: A musical evening organised by Mhairi, for which tickets will be sold. SATURDAY: There will be a concert and ceilidh evening for which tickets will be sold. Numbers are limited as priority goes to family members of the children taking part in fiddle week.

SUNDAY: The Hall will be open to the public between 2.00 and 4.00pm.

- Two tills will be required for the bar.
- Iain has ordered the banner for the front of the Hall.
- Margaret will look at curtain material when she is in Glasgow.
- Liz will ask Lindsey Hook about the possibility of help with curtains from Johnstone's.
- Work is progressing well. The scaffolding is coming down, painters are working and new doors have been chosen.
