Village Hall Project	Gordon reported that the	
	Business Plan has been	
	approved by the CAT team and	
	is now with the Corporate	
	Management Team. If it is	
	approved by them, it will go to	
	The Policy and Resources	
	Committee in March. This	
	means that the work is unlikely	
	to start in the summer.	
	Gordon stated that a request	
	has been made to Moray	
	Council to contribute £150,000	
	towards maintenance and, if	
	this is not forthcoming, it would	
	make the project	
	unsustainable, creating a huge	
	liability for the directors.	
	In answer to a suggestion that	
	people should write to the	
	Council stating their support,	
	Stewart said it would helpful	
	for people and groups to write	
	to The Village Association	
	stating:	
	Their support for the project.	
	Why the hall is unique.	
	The reasons for keeping the	
	Hall open.	
	What would happen if it closed.	
	A suggestion was made that a	
	list of reasons for keeping the	
	Hall open could be made	
	available at the public	
	consultation sessions to allow	
	people to identify their	
	preferences.	
	Gordon stated that the local	

	councillors supported the project and he hoped they would show their support in Committee.  There was discussion around the need for a public meeting.  Donald stated he would ask the Community Council to write in support.  Different sources of funding were suggested and will be pursued.
